## GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH REFUGEE/IMMIGRANT STATEMENT

Grace Lutheran Church is a community of Christians dedicated to following Jesus' teaching and example. In Matthew 25:35, Jesus said, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Jesus made it clear that when we welcome the stranger into our homes and our hearts – we welcome him.

The Reverend Elizabeth A. Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA tells us, "...banning vulnerable refugees will not enhance our safety, nor does it reflect our values as Christians. Instead, it will cause immediate harm by separating families, disrupting lives, and denying safety and hope to brothers and sisters who are already suffering."

We believe this calls us to advocate for the dignity of all God's people, even in the face of difficult issues, for silence can be seen as acceptance.

Given the above understandings, Grace Lutheran commits to being a safe place that welcomes and accepts immigrants and refugees. We recognize the dignity and human rights of all people to live free of prejudice and discrimination, regardless of race, religion, or status. We encourage our leaders, civic groups, churches, and residents to support efforts to promote fairness and inclusion in our communities.

The pastor and Synod Assembly representatives shall present these issues and concerns in the form of resolutions and memorials at the Synod Assembly.
